

## **The IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme) Scholarships - Terms and Conditions**

1. **The IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme) Scholarships** will be awarded to successful entries of either a digital or written entry on the topic of **“Why the world needs lawyers.”**

There are 4 x £2,500 scholarship awards to be used towards the **IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme) running at The College of Law, London Moorgate centre, in September 2012.**

Entries sent to the wrong email or postal address or received after the closing date will not be considered.

Entrants must by midnight **on 20 July 2012** have booked a place to study the **IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time programme)** at The College of Law, London Moorgate centre commencing September 2012. Entrants booking their place after this date will not be considered.

1. The £2,500 scholarship will be offset against the 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of the full course fee for the IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme) commencing in September 2012.
2. No cash alternative is available. Scholarships are not transferable to another individual or academic year. If a successful candidate does not take up their place on the course, the scholarship will be lost.
3. Successful entrants will be notified directly by **27 July 2012**. Their names will also be posted on The College of Law website, Future Lawyers Network and the IBA Student Committee webpages. The College of Law is unable to acknowledge individual entries. The decision of the judging panel is final and individual correspondence regarding the decision will not be entered into. The College of Law is unable to return entries after judging has taken place.
4. Successful entrants must be willing to participate in any further promotional activity as required by The College of Law.
5. Scholarship submissions must be the entrants' own work. Any proven form of plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification. By submitting your entry you confirm that you have not infringed or diluted any third party intellectual property rights including copyright. You also agree to indemnify in full the College and its employees against the costs of any actions taken or threatened as a result of your infringement or otherwise of any third party intellectual property rights

6. Existing College of Law students are eligible to submit an entry for **IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme) Scholarship**.
7. Candidates who have secured full financial sponsorship for the **IBA/College of Law LL.M in International Legal Practice (full-time in London programme)** are not eligible to participate. Entrants who subsequently obtain financial sponsorship will not be eligible.
8. College of Law employees and their immediate families or anyone connected to the judging panel are not eligible to submit an entry.

### Judging Criteria

Entries will be judged by a College of Law panel, comprising College of Law and IBA legal professionals. They will be judging work on its ability to demonstrate the following professional skills required by modern law firms:

- communication (written or oral)
- creative thinking
- analytical thinking
- commercial awareness
- knowledge
