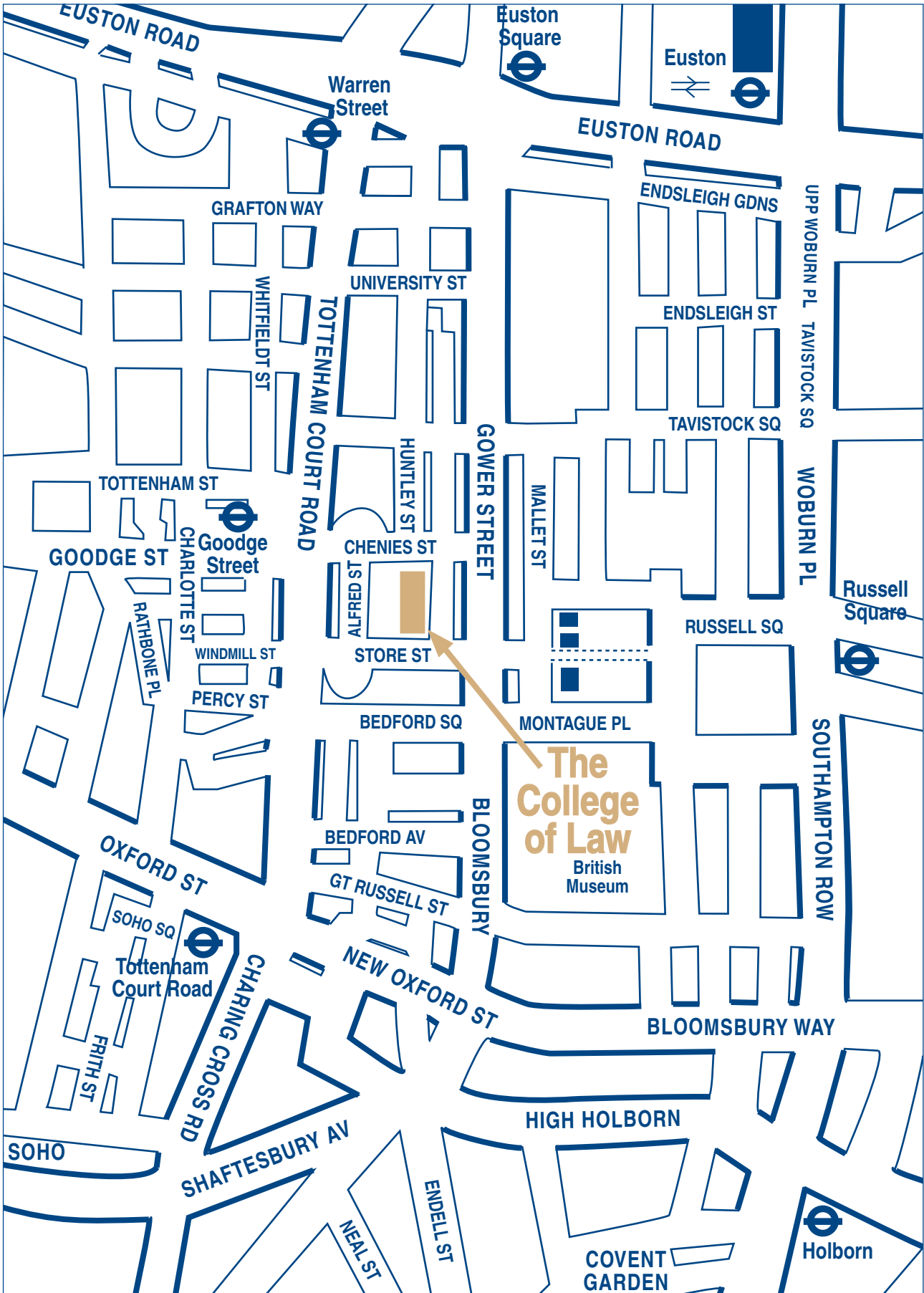

## Directions to the London centre in Bloomsbury

The College's central location makes it very accessible, with numerous tube, rail and bus routes nearby. Further information on local transport and facilities is listed below. For more detailed help in planning your journey we recommend the following websites.

### Walking distances

It is possible to walk in from Islington or Pimlico in about 40 minutes.

### By Bus

The College is very near the following bus routes. Catch buses going north from Tottenham Court Road and those going south from Gower Street.

- 10** Hammersmith to Kings Cross
- 24** Pimlico to Hampstead via Camden
- 73** Victoria to Tottenham via Islington
- 134** Tottenham Court Road tube to North Finchley via Camden

If you walk down to Tottenham Court Road tube station there are numerous buses going east and west.

### By underground

London Bloomsbury is extremely well served by underground stations, from Goodge Street Station just a couple of minutes away to Euston which is about a 10 minute walk. Those within walking distance are listed below with the nearest first.

<b>Russell Square</b>	Piccadilly Line
<b>Tottenham Court Road</b>	Central and Northern Line
<b>Warren Street</b>	Victoria and Northern Lines
<b>Euston Square</b>	Hammersmith and City, Circle and Metropolitan Lines
<b>Euston</b>	Victoria and Northern Lines
<b>Holborn</b>	Central and Piccadilly Lines

### By Car/Bike

Driving to College is not recommended because of the difficulty in parking. If you have to drive in, there are meters and 'pay and display' in the area. These are only good for short term parking.

If you need longer term parking there are NCP car parks near Russell Square and in Berners Street with fairly hefty daily rates. Note that they can fill up early in the day. For motorbikes there are many parking bays in the surrounding areas that are free of charge.

Limited car parking is available to students with disabilities for whom a car is essential. Students who fall into this category should contact the learning support coordinator.

Bicycle racks are provided between the Store Street building and Ridgmount Place. Good newsagents and book shops sell cyclists' maps of London which may help you find the safest route to College.
